Use citation generators and managers.

Learn exactly what to cite: Who, What, Where and When of your Sources

Citations (references) give credit to others for their work and ideas, and allow readers to track the original work. This applies to written sources used (books, articles, web pages), and other formats (images, sounds, DVDs). Whenever you use someone else's words or ideas in your paper, you must indicate that this information is borrowed by citing your source. Failure to cite sources is considered plagiarism.

Know your sources | Is your source reliable?

Not all books, articles, and websites are appropriate for every paper you will write. Some sources might look attractive but could jeopardize the strength of your research if they are not authentic, reputable, and academic.

You need to cite each source that you use twice:

In the text of your paper: in-text citation for APA and MLA styles, and a footnote or endnote for CMS style. In the list of Works Cited (MLA), References (APA) or Bibliography (CMS), placed at the end of your essay.
